- 2. Enhance learning and personal development of mentees through guidance from mentors as well as exclusive leadership development activities for mentees
- 3. Provide an avenue for mentees and mentors to make meaningful contributions to the community together

Please submit an application online, https://forms.gle/aTRfLUrvivC36fCb6 make payment for application fee of \$15 by latest **16 May 2020**. As first round interviews are conducted on a rolling basis, we encourage you to submit your applications early.

Selection Process

The YWLC Mentorship Selection Committee will conduct selection of mentees from May – June 2020. Mentee selection will consist of an initial screening round via phone interview, followed by a 30-minute interview with members of the YWLC Mentorship Selection Committee for successful candidates.

Mentorship Programme applicants will be assessed based on the following criteria:

- 1. Willingness to learn
- 2. Leadership potential
- 3. Compassion towards society
- 4. Level of commitment

Confirmation and Mentor Allocation

Selected mentees will be matched to their mentors with the following factors in mind:

- 1. Area(s) of interest
- 2. Industry relevance
- 3. Preference, if any

Successful applicants will be notified and matched to their mentors by early July 2020.

Note: The total programme fee is **\$\$135** (including the \$\$15 administration fee paid upon application) to cover the running costs of the Mentorship Programme.
